Volunteer Regulations

Sign in and out at the front desk each time you volunteer, this process is in place to confirm who is in the building in case of an emergency evacuation, provide accurate volunteer data for our annual reports, and keep a tally on how awesomely dedicated you are!

It is your responsibility to keep the Volunteer Coordinator informed on any changes to your schedule, absences, or vacations and to follow directions given by LRHS staff.

If you are unsure of something ask a staff member. If you feel uncomfortable doing something—don't. Treat information on adopters/surrenders with sensitivity and confidentiality.

Treat customers, staff and volunteers with respect. Act professionally.

Dress Code

- Wear closed-toed shoes with good traction and support. For your own safety, if you wear heels, flip flops or other dangerous footwear, you will be asked to change shoes prior to volunteering.
- Shorts should end below the knee and be free of rips, so that legs are protected.
- Wear shirts that are free of profanity and drug/ alcohol related materials, and that cover your entire belly, back, chest and shoulders.
- Wear clothes that you do NOT care about, you will get dirty...we can guarantee you that!
- Please refrain from wearing earphones.

History & Mission

LRHS has been providing safe and compassionate shelter for lost, abused or unwanted animals since 1995 when we were originally located in Tuftonboro, NH. In 2007 we relocated to our current space, an old farmhouse, off of Old Route 28 in Ossipee, NH.

Our mission is to care for abused and abandoned dogs and cats, and provide them with food, exercise, warmth, and affection while we work on finding them their ideal forever homes.

We see to it that pets care for are fully vetted, spayed, and neutered prior to leaving our shelter. We do not euthanize pets as a means of population control. Rather than cage cats we allow them to roam free in our "community cat rooms".

We are contracted to serve the surrounding towns of: Effingham, Ossipee, Wolfeboro, and Tuftonboro.

LRHS is a 501(c)(3), independent, non-profit organization. 100% of our fundraising efforts stay right here, at our facility, with our pets.

Volunteer: Our volunteer process is quick and easy.

Step 2: LRHS will call you to set up an Orientation Appointment so we can show you the ropes.

Step 3: Volunteer; whether your preference is dog walking, cat cuddling, facility maintenance, landscaping or getting down and dirty to help us clean, we will be sure to find a job for you!

Foster a Pet: For a week, a month or forever!

When LRHS takes in a cat or dog that needs extra behavioral or medical help than we can handle on our own, we call our foster parents for a hand. This program helps free up space at LRHS while ensuring that our needier pets receive the special attention they require. Call or stop in to inquire about becoming a LRHS Foster Parent.

Don't judge-remember that life happens and that's why we're here.

Be positive.

Demonstrate the techniques you are discussing, such as how to brush a cat.

Present pets in optimistic ways. Rather than stating, "this cat does not like to be held" say "this cat enjoys being independent."

"this dog hates kids" vs. "this dog prefers to be in adult company."

Age Limitations:

Children under 16 years old must be accompanied by a guardian at all times when at LRHS.

Teens 16—17 may volunteer on their own providing that a guardian signs their volunteer application.

Adults 18+ may volunteer on their own after signing the volunteer application and attending an orientation.
